






3. The length of the Summer Institute

4. Parallel sessions organisation







6. The quality of the scientific presentations





7. The quality of the poster session






10. Food and Beverage



12. The outdoor activity





13. Networking opportunities (perspective of collaboration)



14. Global organization (work & disponibility of the Idiap staff)



12750007	The "GEKO" session was a chaotic waste of time. The initial brainstorming was good. However, SIG 1 was too big, with too many topics. The "chair" of SIG 1 was useless: he allowed the conversation to be completely dominated by one person (with many people silent); the conversation was aimless, with no structured (no keywords, topics, agenda); the chairman then gave the worst summary of any meeting I have ever witnessed. The technical sessions were inconsistent in topic - and too much attempting to impress peers, rather than informing a more general audience. One guy had around 30 slides of advanced mathematics but failed to state the purpose. So, nobody asked any questions - they were all doing their email. Silly.
